

The MCG has very limited car parking so taking public transport may be my best option.



I have downloaded my ticket from the Ticketek app to my phone's wallet or I have my physical membership card.



When I arrive at the MCG, I will check my ticket for the correct gate to enter and then join the queue. There will be lots of noisy and excited people waiting outside the stadium.



If I have mobility needs, I can use the free 'G Train shuttle service to help me get from Richmond Station, Jolimont Station or the accessibility parking area in Yarra Park to the MCG.





Before I enter, I will need to complete the MCG's security process. I may be asked to pass through a metal detector or open my bag.

This is for safety reasons.



Security may also scan me with their wand. They may ask me to lift up my arms and turn around.



I will scan my ticket at the turnstile using my phone. When the light on the screen turns green, I will push the metal turnstile arms or wait for the gate to open and enter the stadium.



I will find my seat using the information on my ticket and watch the footy from my allocated seat.

Section M is Level 1, Section N is Level 2, Section P is Level 2A (Warne Stand) or Level 3 (all other stands), Section Q is Level 4.





The crowd will make a lot of noise when their team runs out, scores a goal or the game ends.

I might see smoke, fire or flashing lights and hear the siren and loud music during breaks in play.



If I need a break from the stimulation of the footy, I can visit the MCG's Sensory Friendly Space.

The Space is located inside Gate 3 on Level 1





I can buy food and drink as well as merchandise both inside and outside the MCG using my bank card. The MCG is a cashless venue.



If I need help, I can ask the MCG Staff. They wear orange, blue and green uniforms. Security, First Aid and Victoria Police are also available if I need them.
